WHY GUATEMALA?

In Guatemala's Western Highlands, 4 out of 5 indigenous adults live in poverty and 1 in 3 cannot read or write. The GLP aims to change that by bringing educational opportunities to dozens of additional schools and students across the region every year.

Approximately 150 Rotary Clubs and 25 Districts will partner to serve about **400 teachers and 6,600 students in 50 schools** through GG#2351451. The GLP is one of the largest grassroots, multi-club, multi-district projects in the Rotary world!



DID YOU KNOW?

Over 800 clubs and 90 districts in 11 countries have partnered to support the GLP since 1997!

COMMUNITY NEEDS ADDRESSED

- 1 Ineffective teaching methods
- 2 Lack of books and computers
- 3 Pressure on students to drop out of school



SUSTAINABILITY

GLP programs are sustainable for the long term thanks to **community ownership** and an **innovative "revolving fund" model**. Parents pay a small monthly fee for their children to use the books or computers. Schools save this money in a designated fund which is eventually used to buy new books and computers as the old ones wear out.
