## Set-Up Instructions

### **In this PDF you will find the following:**

### **Materials needed to make the display board:**

- Tri-fold display board, at least 36 in x48 in (black suggested, available at Staples for ~US\$15)
- Tape or glue stick
- Scissors or paper-cutter
- White paper (please use 11”x14” piece of paper for the GLP “title” logo if possible, as it is currently sized to fit those dimensions in this document)
- Printer

### **Instructions**

1. Obtain materials listed above.
2. Print color copies of the images included in this PDF (pages 3–17).
3. Cut out the images from the printed PDF document.
4. Arrange the images on the display board, referring to the enclosed photo (page 2) of where to place the images.
5. Using tape or a glue stick, secure the images onto the display board.
6. Feel free to replace any of the photos with your own!

### TEXTBOOK PROJECT

This Sustainable Project brings old textbooks to secondary schools in Guatemala, providing students with important learning and reading materials that would otherwise be discarded.



### COMPUTER CENTER PROJECT

In the computer center, students have the opportunity to learn the basics of computer use, and to get better jobs and further education after graduation. The center has a recycling fund.

Spark provides teachers with the materials and skills they need to foster **improved literacy** and a life-long love of reading in their students.



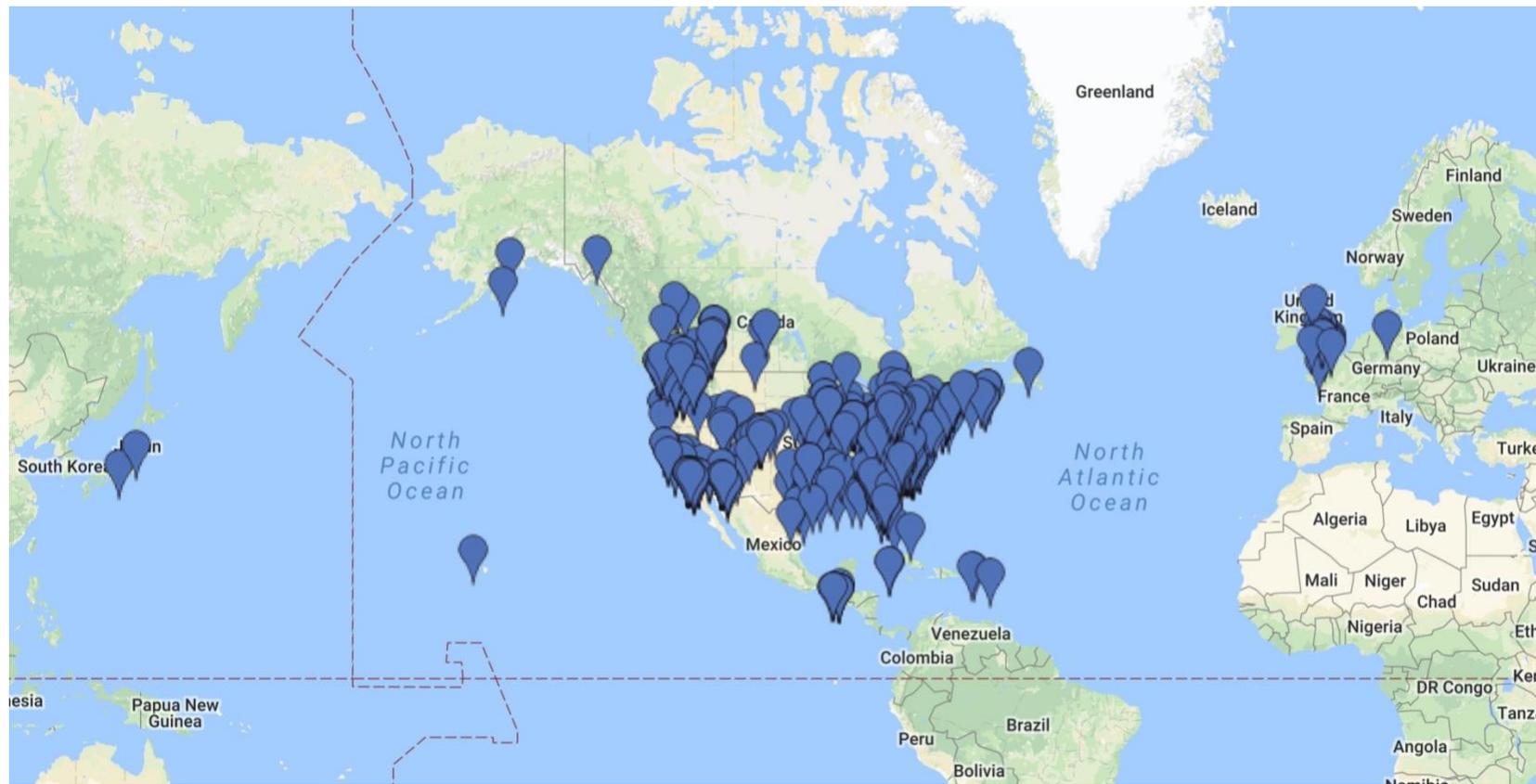
# RISE PROGRAM

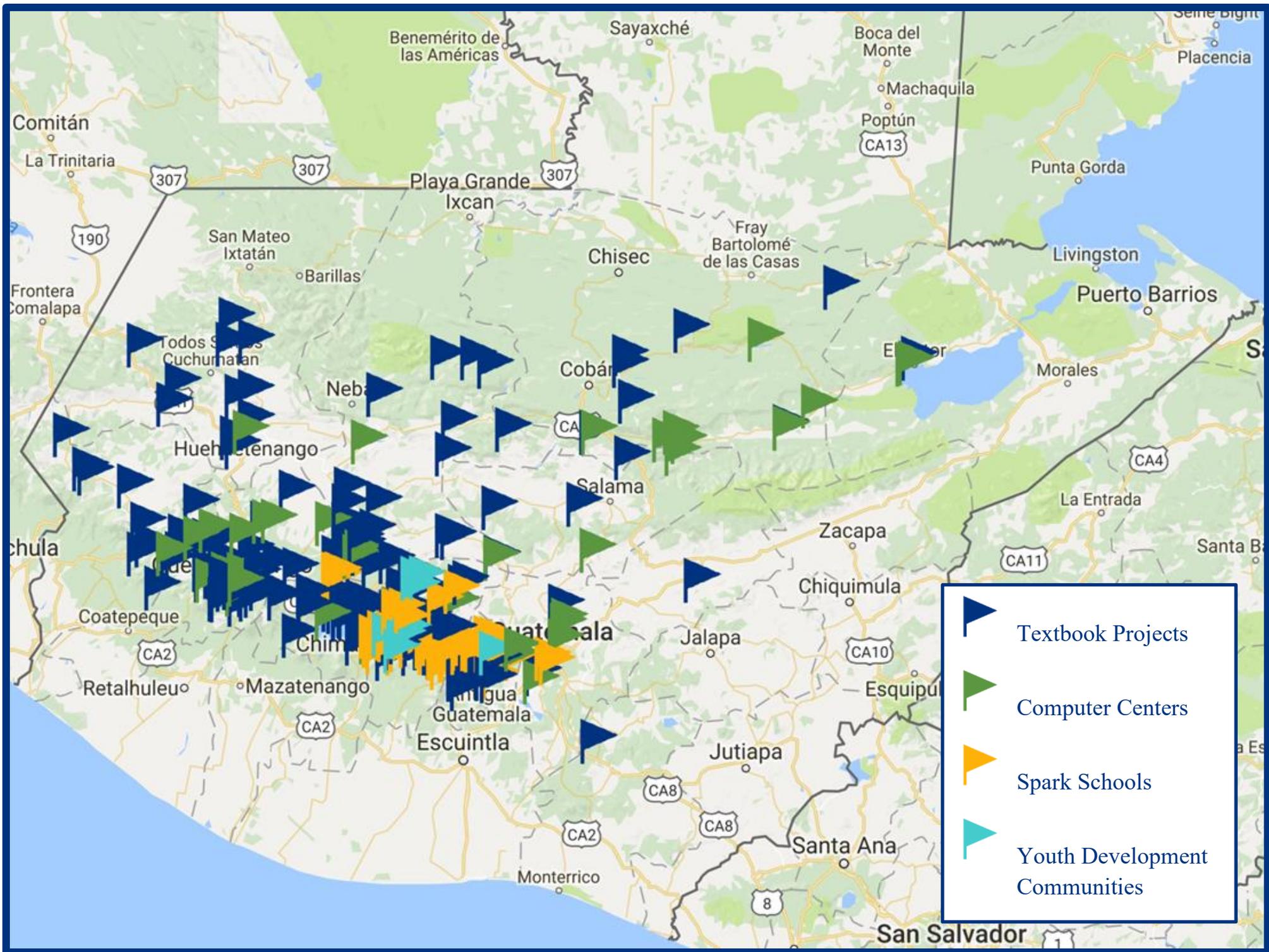
